PITSTICK, Arthur H. age 95 of Yellow Springs, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, October 02, 2012 at Greenwood Manor. He was born on January 1, 1917 to the late Anthony and May (Urlach) Pitstick in Bay City, Michigan. In addition to his parents, Arthur is preceded in death by his loving wife of 60 years, Martha Pitstick; two sons: Steven E. and Frank V. Pitstick; a brother, Edward A. Pitstick and a sister, Lucille Backhoff. He is survived by his children: James A. (Kathryn) Pitstick, David R. (Christine) Pitstick, Ronald J.
