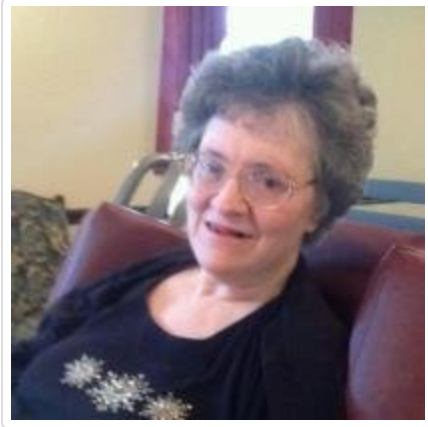




Mary Ann Perry
